

Complaints Procedure

The Lime Trees is committed to providing a safe, stimulating, consistent and accessible service to children and their parents/carers. We always aim to provide high quality services for everyone, but accept that sometimes things do not always go to plan. In such circumstances we want to know so that we put them right and learn from mistakes.

Stage one

If a parent/carer has a complaint about aspect of The Lime Trees, it will often be possible to resolve the problem by simply speaking to the individual concerned and or/ to the manager. As outlined in the Partnership with parents/carers policy, The Lime Trees is committed to open and regular dialogue with parents/carers and the club welcomes all comments.

In the first instance, parents/carers are encouraged to speak directly to the relevant member of staff, if deemed appropriate. If not, the manger should be approached and they will try to resolve the problem. If a satisfactory resolution cannot be found, then stage two of the procedure will be formally come into operation.

Stage two

If informal discussions of a complaint or problem have not produced a satisfactory resolution to the situation, parents/carers should put their complaint in detail and in writing to the Operations Manager, who will oversee the investigation that's been carried out by the day to day manager. All relevant names, dates, evidence and any other important information, must be included.

The Lime Trees will acknowledge receipt of the complaint as soon as possible- within three working days at least. And fully investigate the matter within 10 days. If there is a delay, The Lime Trees will advise the parents/carer of this and offer an explanation. The Day to Day Manager is responsible to replying to the complaints.

If the manager has good reason to believe that the situation has a safeguarding issues, they should inform the Safeguarding officer and ensure the MASH team have been informed, within 48hrs. If the manager believes that a criminal offence has been committed, then they should contact the police.

The formal response to the complaint from The Lime Trees will be sent to the parent/carer concerned and copied to all relevant members of staff if appropriate. The response will include recommendations for dealing with the complaint and for any amendments to the club policies and procedures emerging from the investigation.

The Day To Day manager will arrange a time to meet the parent/carer concerned and any other relevant individuals, such as members of staff, to discuss the complaint and the club's response.

Third Stage

If the conclusion of these process parents/carers remains dissatisfied with the response, the original complaint along with the club's response will be passed to the registered person Gareth Degenhart. The registered person will respond within three days and arrange a time to meet parents and carers. If a further investigation is required this matter will be investigated with 7 working day and reported back to the parent/carer and any other relevant adults
